02/27: Exodus 1	What does it mean to "fear" God? Does "fear" motivate you to obey Him? (Acts 9:31;2 Cor 5:11)
02/28: Exodus 2	God saw and God knew. How important is <u>v25</u> regarding what you have before you today?
03/01: Exodus 3	Why do you think God referred to Himself as "I AM"? (See also <u>John 8:58-59; 18:4-6</u>)
03/02: <u>Ex 4:1-17</u>	God doesn't call the qualified. He qualifies the called. How might that be encouragement for you today?
03/03: <u>Ex 4:18-31</u>	Why was Moses' life in danger & what was the importance of Zipporah's intervention? (Gen17:9-14)

REFLECT

Why is the discipline of *remembering* important?

God was intentional in how He led the Israelites. Where do you need His guidance today? What was the reason God hardened Pharaoh's heart? (v4) How can this be your mission today? What was Israel's role in the battle v. God's role in the battle? How can this apply to your life today? Israel feared & believed in God that day. But they would soon complain & disobey. Can you identify? If you asked an Israelite that day "Who is the LORD & what has He done?" what would he/she say? What are ways to diligently listen to the voice of the LORD?

REFLECT

03/20: Heb 11:23-29 What motivated Moses and how can you have that same motivation today? Is it harder to obey God when you don't understand? Why should that not matter? Again, the Israelites want to go back to Egypt. If a Christian, do you ever want to go back to your old life? Do you have the kind of friendships these guys had? How can you be this kind of friend today? How was Jethro's counsel good leadership & kingdom advice? Where can the church learn from this? Where do you see God's holiness? Spend time thanking God for the cross. Where do you see your sinfulness? (See also 1 John 3:15 & Matthew 5:28). Thank God for the cross.

REFLECT

What do you think Moses did while he waited on the LORD? How do you think Moses felt? What determined the amount of a person's contribution? (v2) How can you trust your heart? Whether he realized it or not, Moses was building a shadow. (See Hebrews 10:1-10) 03/30: Ex 28:1-5; 29:1-9 Whether they realized it or not, Aaron and his sons were shadows also. (See Hebrews 10:11-22) The altar of incense may symbolize prayer (Ps 141:2; Rev 5:8). How often should we pray? (vv7-8) Have you thought of your skills as gifts from God? How are you using them for His kingdom? Why does God say "Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths?" How does this apply to you?
