| READ | REFLECT |

| 05/15: 1 Sam 1, 3 | How much communication does God desire with you? What could that look like? Pray using 2:1-10. |
| 05/16: 1 Sam 8 | Did God want Israel to have a king? Why would God grant them a king while they rejected Him? |
| 05/17: <u>1 Sam 9</u> | Where do you see God working in cho? Where is He working out His specific plans for your life? |
| 05/18: <u>1 Sam 10</u> | What does this say re: Sam, Saul, Israel, & God? Can you have an earthly king & God be your King? |
| 05/19: <u>1 Sam 12</u> | Why can't empty things "profit or deliver"? Answer is in v21. How could Sam sin against God? (v23) |
| 05/20: <u>1 Sam 13</u> | Reread 10:8. Have you ever tried to rush or 'force' God's will? (13:12). How did it work out for Saul? |
| 05/21: 1 Sam 15 | Partial obedience is disobedience. Where are you sort of obeying God? Pray for discernment. |

| 05/22: <u>1 Sam 16</u> | If only one phrase in v18 could fit on your tombstone, which one would you want to describe you? |
| 05/23: <u>1 Sam 17</u> | While this is an historical event, who/what does Goliath, David, & Israel represent in your life today? |
| 05/24: 2 Sam 1 | King Saul tried to kill David, but David never fought back. What does this say about David's faith? |
| 05/25: 2 Sam 2:1-3:1 | In <u>2:1</u> , note how precise are David's prayers. What specifics should you pray for today? |
| 05/26: 2 Sam 5 | In v12. David knew God made him king. Why is knowing God's will vital and how can you know it? |
| 05/27: 2 Sam 6 | <u>Uzzah</u> assumed he was more righteous than dirt. Where do you need to grow in reverence for God? |
| 05/28: 2 Sam 7 | After hearing God's words, note David's response. How should the Bible impact how you pray? |

| 06/02: <u>2 Sam 22</u> Us | se this song (also in Psalm 18) to praise God for who He is and thank Him for what He has done. |
| 06/03: 2 Sam 23 Ali | Imost an entire chapter is given to men who surrounded David. Who are your mighty men/women? |
| 06/04: <u>2 Sam 24</u> Se | ee 1 Chron. 21:1. Why was it wrong for David to call for a census & what can we learn from this? |

| 06/07: 1 Kings 9:1-9 | What does God say He will do? What are Solomon's responsibilities? |
| 06/08: 1 Kings 10 | If you were this brilliant & wealthy, how difficult would it be to trust God? |
| 06/09: 1 Kings 11 | What a sad ending to a man's life. Read <u>2 Cor. 6:14-18</u> . How can we avoid this kind of downfall? |
| 06/10: 1 Kings 12 | Rehoboam didn't like his advisers' counsel, so he chose new advisors. How open are you to input? |
| 06/11: 1 Kings 14 | Jeroboam hoped for healing, but he had lived in disobedience. How important is it to fear God? |

| 06/14: 1 Kings 19 | In pursuing Jesus, have you ever felt alone? If so, pray God will show that you are in good company. | |
| 06/15: 1 Kings 21 | See Mal. 4:5-6 & Matt. 17:1-13. Consider the JTB connection & why Elijah was at the transfiguration. | |
| 06/16: 1 Kings 22 | Micaiah had a reputation for telling the truth even when it hurts. Do you love the truth that much? | |
| 06/17: 2 Kings 1-2 | Are you an Elisha to someone and an Elijah to others? If not, pray you will be both. | |
| 06/18: 2 Kings 4:1-6:23 | See <u>6:17</u> . What might be available around you, yet difficult to see? Pray that you may see. | |

| 06/19: Ezra 1 | See <u>Isaiah 44:28-45:6</u> . Consider how our sovereign God can use anyone to accomplish His will. |
| 06/20: Ezra 3 | Why do you think they built the altar first? How does this speak to your priorities? |
| 06/21: Ezra 4 | How do (and should) you process & handle opposition? Particularly to what seems to be God's will? |
| 06/22: Ezra 5-6 | Where in the text do you see God doing immeasurably more? How can you pray for the same today? |
| 06/23: Ezra 7 | What did Ezra set his heart to do (v10) & why was he sent (vv14-26)? What about your heart & feet? |
| 06/24: Ezra 8 | Ezra said it (v22) & he believed it (v18). Where do you see the good hand of God in your life? |
| 06/25: Ezra 9-10 | What things did Ezra do first (ch9). How did they respond (ch10)? Where may you need repentance? |
