## The Story Devotional Plan 2023 Chapter 7: Prophets

Below you will see 28 days of Scripture to use in your time alone with God AND to prep for the upcoming Sunday. Here are some tips to get you started:

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- For all of these passages, we encourage you to <u>SOAP</u> the text. For each day, we provide a statement or question to help you observe the text in order to apply it to your life. DANIEL	
READ	REFLECT
08/07: <u>Daniel 1</u>	Name at least 3 places where you see God at work in <u>ch1</u> . What is the common thread in each of these situations?
08/08: <u>Daniel 2</u>	Notice what Daniel does before he gets the interpretation. ( <u>vv17-18</u> ) Notice what he does after he receives the interpretation. ( <u>vv19-23</u> ) Notice what he tells the king before he tells him the interpretation. ( <u>vv27-28</u> ) Notice what the king says after he hears the interpretation. ( <u>vv27-28</u> ) Notice what the gray says after he hears the interpretation. ( <u>vv17</u> ) Now how does all this apply to your life?
08/09: <u>Daniel 3</u> 08/10: <u>Daniel 4</u>	Focus on <u>vv16-18</u> . How can you emulate their confidence ( <u>v16</u> ), faith ( <u>v17</u> ), and allegiance ( <u>v18</u> ) today? <u>Ch4</u> ends with: "those who walk in pride he is able to humble". Read <u>James 4:6</u> and <u>1 Peter 5:5</u> . Why was it important that King Nebuchadnezzar be humbled?
08/11: <u>Daniel 5</u>	How can humbling situations be good news for you? Notice <u>vv16-17</u> . Daniel could have agreed to accept the gifts. And he was awarded them in <u>v29</u> .
08/12: <u>Daniel 6</u>	Why do you think Daniel initially turned them down? Is there a principle to apply to your life today? Daniel was known as a man who served God continually. ( <u>v20</u> ) Notice in <u>v10</u> what Daniel did when he realized he could die if he kept praying to God.
08/13: <u>Daniel 9</u>	Would you have had that same response? Why or why not? Daniel's prayer in <u>vv3-19</u> can be used as a model in your personal time with God. Personalize the text and use this prayer today as you meet with God.
	Also notice God's response to Daniel in $\frac{vv20-23}{2}$ and how God may be working as you pray today.
HOSEA PEAD	REFLECT
<b>READ</b> 08/14: Hosea 1-2	<b>REFLECI</b> In <u>2:8</u> we see that Israel used God's gifts to worship a false god. Where have you done this?
	Where do you see God's discipline and love in ch2 and where have you see in it in your life?
08/15: <u>Hosea 3-4</u>	In <u>3:1-3</u> , God tells Hosea to redeem his adulteress wife. Where do you see aspects of the gospel? Consider how difficult this was for Hosea and how this reveals God's love for us?
08/16: <u>Hosea 5-7</u>	Notice in <u>5:13/7:11</u> (and in <u>8:9/12:1</u> ) that Ephraim (a.k.a. Israel) looked elsewhere for help. What people, places, or possessions do you lean on rather than God? According to <u>6:1-6</u> , what does God expect in your relationship with Him?
08/17: <u>Hosea 8-10</u>	Notice in 8:4, that Israel made decisions without God's input. How often do you do that? Consider yesterday. How often did you make decisions without inquiring of or even considering God? As you contemplate what is before you today, stop and ask God for His wisdom and direction.
08/18: <u>Hosea 11:1</u>	
)8/19: <u>Hosea 12:2</u>	<u>Hosea 13:4</u> points us back to Israel's exodus from Egypt, saying "there is no savior" other than God. How would your day have been different yesterday if that phrase was continually on your mind?
08/20: <u>Hosea 14</u>	Ask God to help you meditate on this truth throughout the day today. Every time you stumble, the right response every single time is to return to the LORD. ( <u>v1</u> ) What did that how like in ch412 What should that look like in your life on a daily basis?
ZEPHANIAH	What did that look like in <u>ch14</u> ? What should that look like in your life on a daily basis?

( <u>3:14</u> ) Notice that God Himself is rejoicing over His people with "loud singing". ( <u>3:17</u> ) Throughout the day today, reflect on how much God delights in His children.
