Sermon: Once for All Text: Leviticus 1-27

Sermon Outline:

- 1. Sin should lead us to sacrifice. (1-7)
- 2. Sacrifice still leaves us separated. (8-15)
- 3. Separation shows our need for atonement. (16)
- 4. Atonement should lead us to live differently. (17-27)

Discussion Questions:

On the Day of Atonement, Israel was seeking "at-one-ment" with God.

- 1. Read Leviticus 16. In what ways was this helpful and hopeful for the Israelites to hear?
- 2. Read Hebrews 9:1-10 & 10:1-4. How is this a sobering perspective regarding the sacrificial system?
- 3. Try to put yourself inside the mind of a Jew living around the year 65 A.D., but not having heard the gospel and still living under the sacrificial system found in Leviticus. What would it have been like to read Hebrews 9:11-28 & 10:11-18? What would have been some "shouting out loud" verses?!?
- 4. Reread Hebrews 10:12. The one who sits down is the one who is done working. The resurrection is our evidence that Jesus' sacrifice was sufficient to satisfy all of God's demands so that we could be reconciled to Him. When you think of the good news of Jesus, do you reflect much on the significance of the resurrection? How can you incorporate the importance of the resurrection into your presentation of the gospel to others?
